



Warrior Camp Catch Up

Hello Warrior Camp leaders,

As the weather starts to get colder Camp now feels like a distant memory and as you look outside at tea time it's hard to imagine that only a few months ago, we were out on the field playing the evening game! It was another fantastic year on camp with a new bigger field, hot weather and lots of weird and wonderful children coming onto the field.

The Warrior Camp Decision Making Group (DMG) had a meeting in November and below are the relevant topics that were discussed.

Cromer 2009

There was a feeling that God really blessed us with a fantastic year on camp and feedback from campers, leaders, camp staff and parents has been very positive.

It was a real privilege for all the leaders to see God continuing to use camp to help young Christians grow in their Christian faith and others to ask for salvation. There were many fantastic testimonies about how God had been moving on camp from the very beginning of camp all the way through to the end, with one camper even asking for salvation as they were about to leave the camp field!



Throughout the three weeks we had over 150 children on camp and we praise God for bringing each of these children onto the camp field.

All three weeks were blessed with good weather and it was noticeable what a difference this can make to the atmosphere and mood on camp.

This year we were on a new field (across the road from Teen Camp) and the general consensus towards our new bigger site was positive and that it allowed us a lot more freedom with games and activities.

The DMG and in particular Chris and Rachel would like to thank all the leaders, kitchen staff and helpers who were on Camp this year, as you helped to make it an outstanding year. We were also aware that the camp was constantly being prayed for and we thank the people who were supporting us in this way.

Camp Finances

Although camp was a big success on the field, in terms of finance we were not so fruitful and unfortunately Warrior Camp made a loss of £3,500. This follows on from a loss of £5000 last year and we ask for your continued prayer on this situation.

Warrior Camps income is generated by fees, gifts and on site sales (bookshop, pop shop). Fees

are the biggest source of income and we want to keep these as low as possible for children and leaders, particularly in the present economic climate. If you give or would like to give to Camp and you are a tax payer please consider gift aid. It is very simple to set up either as a one off payment or for regular giving (direct debit) and significantly increases the impact of your gift and will help to keep fees reasonable.

Camp numbers

The number of children on camp this year was lower than previous years and we are asking leaders and people connected to camp to make a real effort to encourage children to come to camp next year.

If we had an extra 65 children on camp this year all paying their £100 fees, we would have met the £6,500 shortfall which camp experienced this year. This works out an extra 20 children each week and is something that we feel is achievable. Word of mouth is camps best advertising tool and we ask leaders to make a special effort this year to promote camp in their churches and youth groups.
