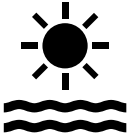

ARRIVAL DAYS

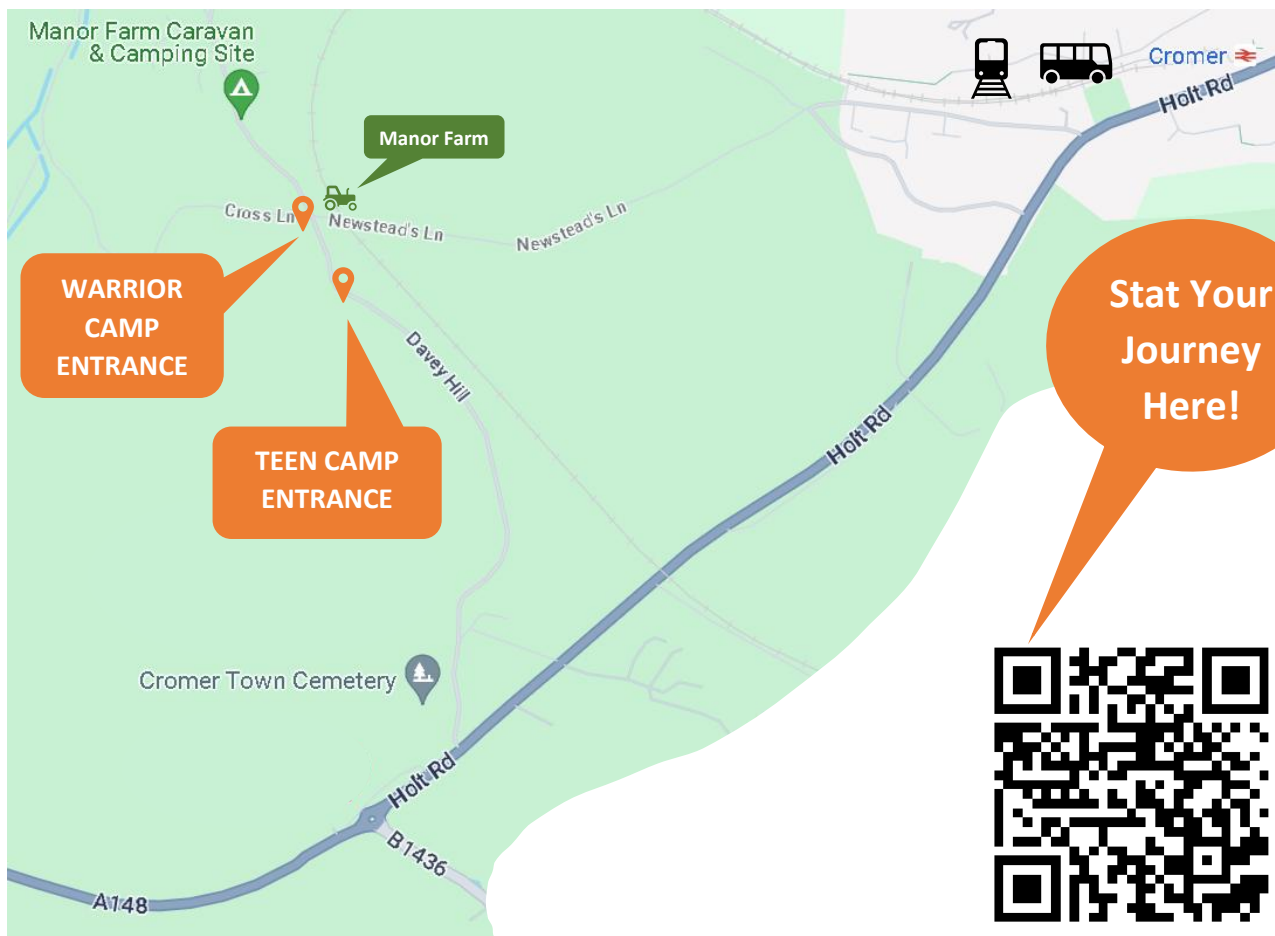


Adult Volunteers – Saturday arrival, Saturday departure
Campers – Sunday arrival, Saturday departure

Leader Day Saturday Arrival: So that we can provide the best experience for our volunteers, **we regret we are unable to accommodate campers coming early with volunteers.** The only exception to this is where campers are relatives of the adult volunteers. Where such children arrive early then they will remain their responsibility at all times, until the formal start of camp on Sunday afternoon.

Please plan to arrive at camp by 2:30pm. The Leader Day programme, a requirement for all adult volunteers, starts at 3:30pm. Tea is the first meal, served on your arrival day at 6pm.

Campers Sunday Arrival: Please do your best to arrive at the campsite between 3pm and 5pm. **We stress that we cannot supervise children prior to 3pm Sunday.** Tea is the first meal, served on your arrival day (Sunday) at 6pm.

JOURNEY BY ROAD

Directions: East Runton is on the A149 (coast road), just west of Cromer. On entering the village from Cromer, turn left, (right, if coming from Sheringham). The lane is sign-posted with an official “Camping/Caravan” brown sign. Follow this lane for about a mile. You will go under the railway line and pass village green areas (one with a duck pond). The lane narrows considerably and **Manor Farm** is on the left. The campsites are just beyond the farm. Look for the Teen Camp and Warrior Camp signs as you get close.

If you are approaching Cromer along the A148 from King’s Lynn, you will see “Manor Farm” sign-posted down a lane on the left, (just after the right turn to Fellbrigg). You will see the camps as you come down the lane. (You may find the access easier if you go down to the village green and turn round). However, please note, the lane from the A148 to the farm is very narrow and not suitable for coaches or minibuses or vehicles towing trailers. Again, look for the Teen Camp and Warrior Camp signs as you get close.



FOR ALL PUBLIC TRANSPORT TRAVEL

The camp site is approximately 20 minutes walk from the railway station along a farm lane.

Walking directions: To reach camp from the station on foot, walk up the hill from the station (Holt Road) until you reach Sandy Lane (the first road on the right after leaving the railway station). Go down Sandy Lane to the end of the road. Cross over and continue along the rough farm track (Newstead Lane). This is signposted Public Footpath or Public Bridleway. The camp fields are at the end of this lane, just after you have gone under the railway line.



Adults and campers can either find their own way to the campsite, or, if preferred, **can be met at the station** and they and/or their luggage can be transported to the site. *We will meet all campers travelling on the trains coming into Cromer on the Sundays at the times indicated below, when Adults will accompany them to the camp site.*

Anyone Wishing To Be Met Must Give Clear Details On The Travel Reply Form That Will Be Sent To You Nearer To The Start Of Camp.



BY TRAIN: Trains to Cromer connect with Inter-city services at Norwich. As you approach Cromer you can see WEC Camp from the left side of the train!

Volunteers: On Saturdays, adults need to use the train that **leaves Norwich at 12:41 and arrives in Cromer at 13:25**. Trains after this time will cause late arrival at camp.

Campers: On Sundays, we will have staff at the station to meet the trains arriving in **Cromer at 15:25 and 16:28**. These trains leave Norwich at **14:41 and 15:41**.

If you miss your train then please let us know.



BY NATIONAL EXPRESS COACH: National Express coaches run to Norwich. From Norwich, use the train service to Cromer, or catch the local bus services – 44A, X40 and X44 - from Norwich Bus station. Alight at East Runton Stores and phone the Camp mobile phone number if you wish to be met.



RETURN JOURNEY (Saturdays): We will ensure that all campers and leaders and their luggage are in Cromer for the **09:49 train**, arriving in Norwich at 10:37 (and London at 12:47).

National Express coaches leave Norwich at 10:15, arriving in London Victoria 13:50. Volunteers and campers using the National Express coaches will need to either catch the train from Cromer at 08:36, or the local bus service from East Runton Stores at 08:34.



BY AIR:

The nearest international airports are Norwich (NWI), Luton (LTN) and Stanstead (STN). We regret that we are unable to collect travellers from airports. Further information and advice for international visitors is available on request.

DEPARTURES (Saturdays):

All campers must aim to leave the camp site by 10.30am on the day of departure. If this is not possible, then please let us know via your travel form.



PACKED LUNCH:

If you would like a packed lunch for the return journey, then this can be ordered via your travel form at a cost of £5.



HELPING OUT:

At the end of Week B, Volunteers are welcome to stay and help with work on the camp site, but do talk to us about this in advance.
